- 5. The institute encourages use of Open Access software for Screen Reading, Recording, Voice Conversion etc to facilitate persons with disability.



The institute uses NVDA open-source screen reader for low vision students.


NVDA Open Source Screen Reader at The TIT&S to facilitate low-vision students.



DIVYANGJAN POLICY

(for differently-abled persons)

1. POLICYFORDIFFERENTLY ABLED PERSONS

Right of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 prohibits discrimination against individuals with physical and mental disabilities. The TIT&S is against all kinds of discrimination on any grounds including disability. The TIT&S intends to advance a comprehensive and inclusive teaching and learning environment in which incapacitated students and employees are not distraught or treated unfavourably. The institute aims to design its programmes, administrations, and activities accessible to the students. All the authorities of the institute are striving to extend a helping hand towards the differently-abled so as to ensure the benefits of ground programmes, administration, and activities. These guidelines apply to all the faculty and staff of the institute.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE POLICY

- ❖ To create Inclusive Culture to avoid discrimination, exploitation and exclusion of Disabled Students and Staff from all spheres of work and education.
- To create suitable regulatory mechanism for effective delivery of services to Disabled Students and Staff of the institute
- To ensure implementation of all legislations with respect to persons with disabilities.
- * To provide accessible and inclusive education at the institute.
- Toensurefullparticipationofpersonswithdisabilitiesandtoprovidethemtheequalopportunit iesfordevelopment.
- To provide necessary budget allocation to achieve above objectives.
- The terms used in the policy have meaning mentioned in Chapter-I of the rights of the persons with disability Act2016.

3. DISABILITY

Disability is a term that includes motor and sensory limitations (e.g., mobility, vision, or hearing-impairments). It also includes disabilities resulting from chronic illnesses and syndrome, invisible disabilities, such as psychological and emotional disorders, learning disabilities, heart disease, diabetes, asthma, arthritis, epilepsy, Acquired Brain Injuries (ABI), and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome(AIDS) are also included in the term disability. Many disabilities vary in degree and type of limitation; therefore, accommodations must also vary and should be tailored to the needs of the individual.

4. QUALIFIEDPERSONWITHDISABILITY

The expression "qualified individual with a disability" alludes to a person with a disability

who is qualified to participate in any given institute programme or activity. About enrolment, a certified individual with a disability must fulfill the scholastic guidelines required for affirmation and meet the scholarly necessities set up for any given course, degree, or certificate programme.

With respect to employment, training, work assignments, and promotion, a qualified individual with a disability must be able to perform the minimum essential functions of the job. Relaxation shall be allowed as per the Government rules.

5.ACCESSIBILITYPOLICY:

Providing access means making all the institute services, activities, and the benefits thereof, fully available to qualified people with disabilities. The institute should provide various provisions in creating a disabled-friendly campus. The institute administration and faculty members should ensure appropriate/reasonable accommodations for each person with a disability and be willing

to resolve access problems. The campus should be barrier free and access ible for persons with different lyabled.

The following principles of accessibility shall be strictly observed:

- All UG and PG programmes and activities must be accessible.
- * Toprovideaccessibletextbooksandstudymaterialtoallstudentswithdisabilities.
- To ensure the awareness programmes for all the teachers and non-teaching staff regarding the issues of accessibility.
- To ensure that web services are compliant to National and international accessibility standards and regulations such as Web content Accessibility Guidelines WCAG with appropriate version and Government of India Guidelines for Web accessibility.
- Admission policy of the Institute offers 5% reservation for persons with disabilities in all the courses offered by Institute. The institute will ensure the representation of all the types of disabilities listed in Rights of Persons with Disabilities 2016 and as per government regulations from time to time.

6.EXAMPOLICY

The TIT&S shall follow the ordinance of Maharshi Dayanand University in matters pertaining to examinations and leverage for the students with disability ector,

Sir/Madam,

I have been directed to inform you that in terms of orders passed by the Vice-Chancellor, the Guidelines for conducting written examination for persons with Disabilities, earlier notified under the orders of the Vice-Chancellor u/s 9 A(5) of University Act vide this office letter No. Conduct/AC-1/2014/12072-12332 dated 1.07.2014, are hereby withdrawn.

The Executive Council of the University, while considering the recommendations of the Committee constituted to examine these Guidelines issued by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Deptt. of Disability Affairs vide No.16-110/2003-DD-III dated 26.2.2013 & forwarded by the Commissioner, Persons with Disabilities, Social Justice and Empowerment Department, Haryana, has resolved to amend the existing Clause 6 (G) of the Ordinance 'Conduct of Examinations' appearing at page 34 of University Calendar Vol. II (Part-B) as under:
